Dr. Martina Šmuclerová is an international law expert and Czech diplomat. She has received her M.A. and Ph.D. in Public International Law from the Sorbonne Law School in Paris and holds a French Government Scholarship and other awards. Martina specializes in law of international security, international space law, international responsibility and law of international organizations. As a Senior Lecturer at Institut d'études politiques de Paris (Sciences PO) Martina teaches various courses in Public International Law, including Space law in collaboration with ESA. As a delegate of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Martina has represented the Czech Republic at the European Space Agency, European Union and at the UN Committee for Peaceful Uses of Outer Space. She has initiated and led important international law projects, such as the UN Space Debris Compendium. Martina is a member of the European Society of International Law and Société française pour le droit international.

The lecture will introduce the international legal framework of space activities in light of current challenges. Particular attention will be devoted to security issues and legal limits to peaceful uses of outer space.
