SECURITY IN OUTER SPACE – STAKES FOR EUROPE



Tomas Hrozensky is a Resident Research Fellow at the European Space Policy Institute (ESPI) in Vienna, Austria. He holds MA and PhD degrees in international relations from the Matej Bel University in Banska Bystrica, Slovakia. Previously he was a visiting Fulbright Scholar at the Space Policy Institute of the George Washington University in Washington, DC, and a researcher

for the Space Security Index 2017 project. During his studies he also completed several internships in the state administration and international organisations. Tomas has several years of volunteer engagement experience in the Space Generation Advisory Council (SGAC) and in his home country he currently chairs the Slovak Space Policy Association NGO, which also serves as a national point of contact for Slovakia in the European Centre for Space Law.

The growing importance of space infrastructure raises new stakes concerning its protection from harmful interference. Experts routinely caution governments and operators about the rising threats to space infrastructure security. This situation has already been widely acknowledged by European stakeholders, including Member States of the European Space Agency (ESA) and the European Union (EU). As the space security discussions gain momentum, Europe sits at the crossroads of important decisions with far reaching consequences.
