

# PSSI'S NATO SUMMER SCHOOL

# EXPANDING NATO HORIZONS

## JUNE 28—JULY 3, 2020

Since 2005, PSSI has joined forces with the NATO's Public Diplomacy Division to offer a select, but intensive, course of study for an elite group of graduate students in political science, international relations and other relevant fields from NATO member states and partner countries concerning future challenges for NATO and pressing issues on the global security agenda.

The one-week course, conducted in English, includes lectures, group discussions and simulations led by Czech and foreign security experts, including sitting and former senior policy practitioners and scholars. The retreat-type setting in Orlik, Czech Republic, provides a rather unique networking opportunity for the approximately 35 participants from as many as 15 countries.

Given our long experience as organizers, we have observed that this off-site venue permits near round-the-clock chances for students and some speakers to engage in in-depth discussions concerning breaking developments as well as reflect on the content of the lectures and the designated simulation. The week-long simulation involves a scenario based on actual circumstances and how they may well play out. Class participation is continuous and active.

- Transatlantic Security
- Strategic Communications
