# **NATO SUMMER SCHOOL OF THE PRAGUE SECURITY STUDIES INSTITUTE**

PSSI's NATO Summer School has been a cooperative effort between NATO's Public Diplomacy Division (PDD) and our Institute over the past fourteen years. Situated at a campus-style resort some 90 minutes outside of Prague, the School is an intensive week-long series of lectures and workshops supervised by various policy practitioners in the fields of security and strategic studies. These have included Ambassador Kurt Volker, current Special Representative for Ukraine to the U.S., former Czech Chief of Staff of the Armed Forces Petr Pavel, Jānis Kazociņš, current National Security Advisor to the President of Latvia, and Roger Robinson former Senior Director of International Economic Affairs at the U.S. National Security Council.

Other lecturers and participants have included senior NATO representatives, Ambassadors of the Czech Republic and current and former policy officials in the fields of cybersecurity, strategic communications, disinformation, missile defense, space security, hybrid warfare (including the economic and financial dimensions) and military affairs. The program accepts some 25 highly-qualified graduate students and young professionals from roughly a dozen countries.



PSSI's NATO Summer School provides an ideal opportunity to interact with security policy luminaries in small group settings, build a global network of contacts and friends and engage in a week-long crisis simulation that requires "real world" decision-making skills and group management.
